## **HEAVEN**

### **Lesson 1**

Does the Bible tell us much about Heaven? Many people will say “no” to that question, but let us look at the data. This is what we find in a study of the New Testament alone.

- 1) “Heaven” occurs 244 times in the New Testament.
- 2) “Heavenly” occurs 23 times in the New Testament.
- 3) “Heaven” occurs 71 times in the Book of Matthew and 52 times in the Book of Revelation.
- 4) In Matthew, most of the references to “Heaven” are those given by Jesus.  
I trust Him to know, don’t you?
- 5) “Heaven” is mentioned in Mark nine (9) times; in the Book of Luke 31 times; in John 16 times; and in Acts 25 times.
- 6) Other New Testament references to Heaven are found in 2 Corinthians (3 times); Ephesians (3 times); Colossians (5 times); Hebrews (9 times); 1<sup>st</sup> Peter (3 times); and 2<sup>nd</sup> Peter (4 times).

Can we know much about Heaven? We can if we study what the Bible tells us about it. My conclusion is that it is an unwarranted assumption to assume that not much can be known about the hereafter.

### **Lesson 4**

#### **WHY LEARN ABOUT THE HEREAFTER?**

- I. IT GIVES US REASON TO REJOICE (Philippians 4:4; 1<sup>st</sup> Thessalonians 4:13)**
  - i. To the saved: This life is as bad as it will ever get.
  - ii. To the lost: This life is as good as it will ever get.
  - iii. To the saved: The best is yet to be.
  - iv. To the lost: The worst is yet to be.
  - v. To both: Heaven and Hell are for eternity. Therefore, saved ones should REJOICE!
  
- II. IT GIVES IMPORTANT TO WHAT WE DO.**
  - i. Everyone you meet has an eternal soul.
  - ii. The commission that Jesus gave the church is clear. (Matthew 28:19-20; Mark 16:15; Acts 1:8)
  
- III. IT GIVES URGENCY TO WHAT WE DO.**
  - i. Life is short and uncertain. (James 4:14; Psalm 90:4-6; Psalm 103:15-16)
  - ii. No one knows the date of Christ's return. (Matthew 24:36)
  
- IV. IT GIVES US HOPE IN THIS LIFE. NO MATTER WHAT, THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT!**
  - i. A new Heaven / a new Earth / Paradise restored
  - ii. A new body (no more temptations / no more physical infirmities, defects, or sicknesses)
  - iii. A new home for the saints: New Jerusalem
  - iv. New conditions of life: Uninterrupted communion with God (Revelation 21:4 and 22:3-4)

## RESURRECTION

### I. THE ESSENTIAL NATURE OF CHRIST'S RESURRECTION

- a. Essential to our salvation (Romans 10:9-10)
- b. Otherwise, we would still be in our sins. (I Corinthians 15:17-19)

### II. THE DIVINE ORDER OF THE RESURRECTION (I Corinthians 15:20-26)

- a. Christ's resurrection – the first fruits
- b. They who belong to Christ at His return (I Thess. 4:16-18)
- c. The rest of the dead raise a thousand years later (Rev. 20:5)

### III. THE NATURE OF THE RESURRECTED BODY

- a. A real physical body – not just a spirit. Heaven is a real place.  
*"A non-physical resurrection is like a sunless sunrise. Resurrection means we will have bodies. If we didn't have bodies, we wouldn't be resurrected."*
- b. R. A. Torrey says, "We will not be disembodied spirits [demons], but redeemed spirits in redeemed bodies in a redeemed universe."
- c. Resurrected bodies call for a new Earth on which to live, work and glorify God.
- d. The whole creation awaits the resurrection. Romans 8:18-23)

### IV. CHRIST'S RESURRECTED LIFE IS A MODEL FOR OURS (Phil. 3:20-21, I John 3:2, I Corinthians 15:49)

- a. Jesus walked and talked with the two disciples on the road to Emmaus
- b. He looked like a man. Mary assumed He was the gardener and called Him, "Sir." -- John 20:15
- c. He invited His disciples to breakfast. John 21:12
- d. He talked with His disciples. Acts 1:4-8

**CONCLUSION:** A new body living on a new Earth is what we see in the Scriptures. God never scrapped His original plan. Instead of destroying all creation because of sin, He redeemed all of creation.

## HEAVEN Lesson 5

### IN HEAVEN, GOD COMPLETES OUR TRANSFORMATION.

In Heaven, God makes all things new. There are two Greek words for “new”:

“Neos” meaning the chronological or temporal newness (example: new clothes).

“Kainos” meaning qualitative newness; something previously unknown, unprecedented, marvelous.

Technology has shown us “kainos” newness. Compare the IBM punch card computer with today’s personal laptop.

#### I. WE WILL RECEIVE A RESURRECTED BODY.

Theologian Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274 AD) thought our resurrected bodies would be like that of a 30-year-old. That may or may not encourage us!

1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 15:35-44:

1. Compared to a seed and the stalk
2. Compared to different kinds of fleshly bodies
3. As the terrestrial compares with celestial bodies
4. As the natural is compared to the spiritual
5. The spiritual is subject to the power of the Holy Spirit. In its resurrected state, it is no longer subject to temptations, sicknesses, infirmities, etc.

#### II. WE WILL CONTINUE AS UNIQUE INDIVIDUALS AND BE ABLE TO RECOGNIZE ONE ANOTHER IN HEAVEN.

- a. On the Mount of Transfiguration, Peter, James and John recognized Moses and Elijah.
- b. Jesus spoke of people recognizing others in Heaven. Matthew 8:11 reads, “And I tell you this, that many Gentiles will come from all over the world and sit down with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob at the feast in the Kingdom of Heaven.” NLT.
- c. We will surely know more there than we do here.
- d. We won’t be “spirits” just floating on clouds.

- e. We won't turn into angels.
- f. We will be ourselves in a resurrected body.

III. OUR RESURRECTED BODIES WILL BE GLORIOUS BODIES, LIKE THAT OF JESUS' (1<sup>st</sup> John 3:1-3)

- a. There are no ordinary people.
- b. C.S. Lewis made a statement that is so thought provoking.
- c. Jesus walked and talked with two disciples on the road to Emmaus.
- d. Jesus looked like a man after resurrection. Mary assumed he was the gardener and called him, "Sir." (John 20:15)
- e. Jesus could eat in his resurrected body. He invited his disciples to breakfast. (John 21:12)
- f. Jesus could talk in his resurrected body. (Acts 1:4-8)
- g. Jesus defied the laws of gravity in his resurrected body and ascended back to Heaven. (Acts 1:9-11)

IV. OUR RESURRECTED BODIES WILL BE IMMORTAL.

- a. Not subject to death (1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 15:51-53)
- b. Indestructible / no aging / no degeneration / no decay.

Joni Erickson Tada, paralyzed as a teenager said, “Oh . . . I am paralyzed. It’s terrible. I don’t like it. But can God still use me paralyzed? Can I, paralyzed, still worship and love Him? He has taught me that I can. Maybe God’s gift to me is my dependence on Him. I will never reach the place where I am self-sufficient, where God is crowded out of my life.

I’m aware of His grace very moment. My need for help is obvious every day when I wake up, flat on my back, waiting for someone to come and dress me. I can’t even comb my hair or blow my nose alone! But I have friends who care. I have the beauty of the scenery. With my art sales, I can even support myself financially – the dream of a handicapped person. The peace that counts is an internal peace and God has lavished me with that peace.

And there’s one more thing. I have hope for the future. The Bible speaks of our bodies being ‘glorified’ in Heaven. In high school that was always a hazy, foreign concept. But now I realize that I will be healed. I haven’t been cheated out of being a complete person – I’m just going through a 40-year delay, and God is with me even through that. Being ‘glorified’ – I know the meaning of that now. It’s the time, after my death here, I’ll be on my feet dancing.”

## HEAVEN

### Session 9: Where are the dead?

Definitions:

1. DEATH means “separation”, not annihilation or ceasing to exist, but separation of spirit and soul from the body.
2. HADES is a Greek word for place of departed spirits which can also be separated into Hell and Paradise, sections of Hades.
3. SHEOL is a Hebrew word for Hades, see above.
4. TARTARUS is a place of silos or chains, it is the prison house of the spirits, of demon spirits and fallen spirits.
5. GEHENNA is the Hell of fire talked about by Jesus eleven (11) times in the NT.
6. MORTAL means subject to death.
7. IMMORTAL means not subject to death.
8. PARADISE is the saved part of Hades or Sheol.
9. THE LAKE OF FIRE is the final burning hell for the lost.
10. THE JUDGMENT SEAT OF CHRIST is where there will judgment for the works of the saved.
11. THE WHITE THRONE JUDGMENT is the judgment of the lost.
12. RESURRECTION is when the corrupted body becomes incorruptible.
13. RAPTURE is when the mortal body becomes immortal.

Job asked, “A man dyeth and where is he?” Job also asked, “If a man die shall he live again?”

The BIBLE tells us clearly of man’s ORIGIN, his NATURE, and his DESTINY.

The Bible tells us man has a material or PHYSICAL nature. (Job 32:8; Zechariah 12:1; Job 14:22; I Cor. 2:11; Matthew 10:28 distinguish between the physical and the spiritual.)

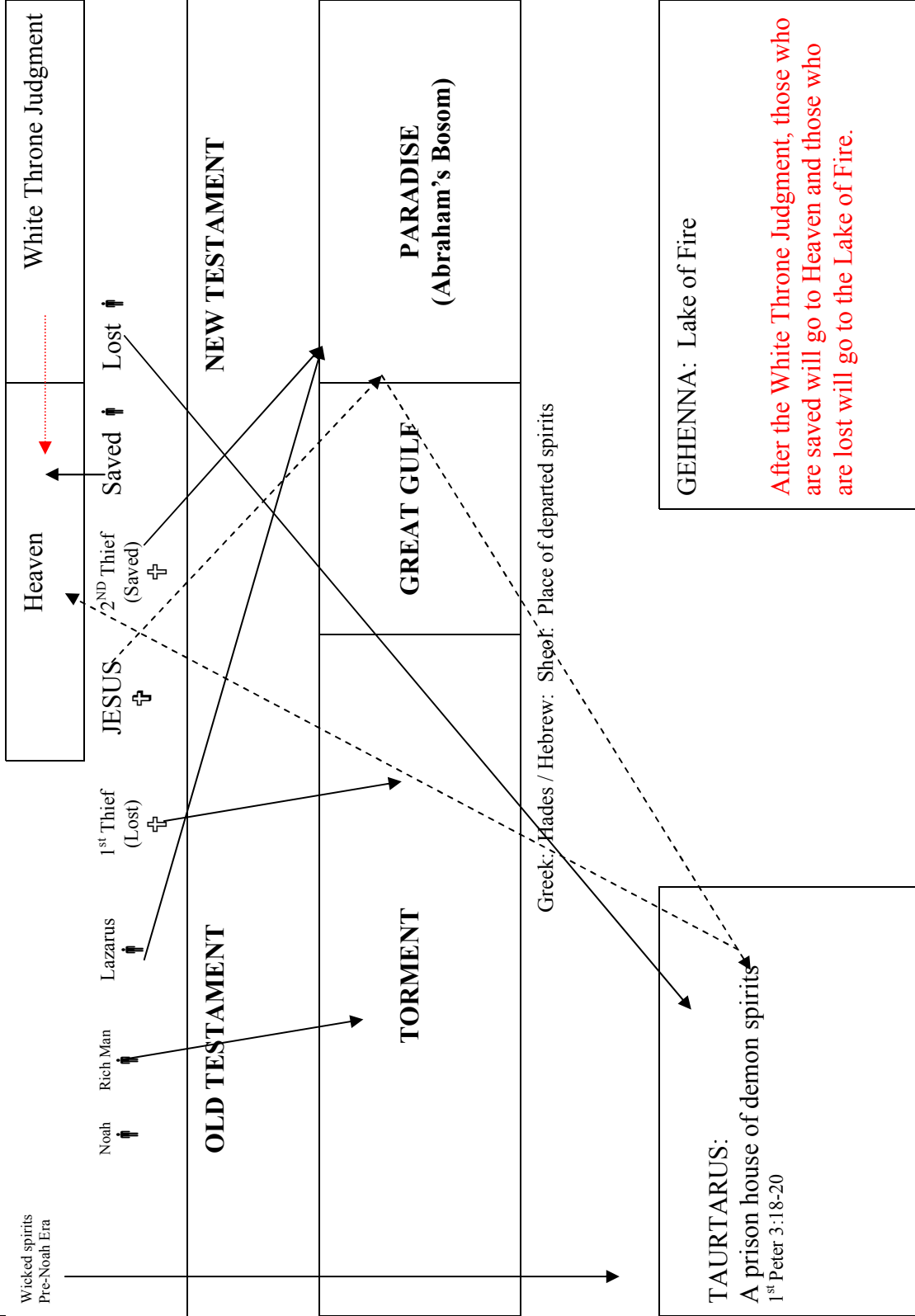
**READ THESE SCRIPTURES:** I Thessalonians 5:23; Hebrews 4:12
